



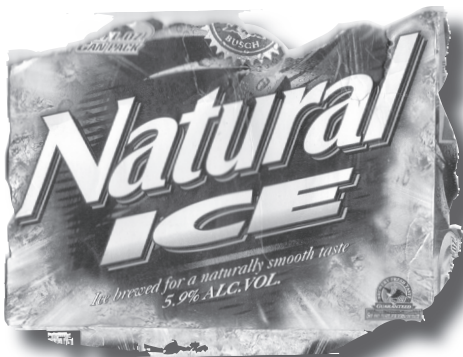
17. Pacifico Clara
